Meeting Summary

The Arkansas/Louisiana West Gulf Coastal Plain Conservation Delivery Network (ARLA CDN) held its second meeting on 7 February 2016 at the Lake D'Arbonne State Park Visitor Center near Farmerville Louisiana. Thirty-four conservation delivery professionals participated, representing the Arkansas Association

of Conservation Districts, Arkansas Forestry Commission, Arkansas Game & Fish Commission, Arkansas Natural Heritage Commission, International Paper, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, National Wild Turkey Federation, The Nature Conservancy Louisiana, Potlatch Corp, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, U.S.D.A.



Natural Resources Conservation Service (Arkansas & Louisiana) and the Lower Mississippi Valley Joint Venture. The meeting agenda and a list of attendees is included with this summary.

The meeting was facilitated by CDN Co-Chairs David Breithaupt (LDWF) and Steve Fowler (AGFC). The primary objective of the meeting was to consider a recommendation by the CDN Delivery Prioritization Tool (DPT) Working Group and to initiate the process to identify potential delivery projects in areas identified by the Delivery Prioritization Tool.

LMVJV Management Board Appreciation Letter

Keith McKnight, Lower Mississippi Valley Joint Venture Coordinator, on behalf of the Lower Mississippi Valley Joint Venture Management Board expressed appreciation for the CDN efforts and encouraged the CDN to provide feedback to the Board regarding how the Board might provide additional support to the CDN. A copy of LMVJV letter of appreciation is included with this summary.

Delivery Prioritization Tool & Strategy

Kate Hasapes (LDWF) reported on the work of the Delivery Prioritization Tool (DPT) Working Group and their proposed Delivery Prioritization Tool. The Working Group was composed of Don Bragg (USFS), Kate Hasapes (LDWF), Bill Holimon (ANHC), Roger Mangham (TNC AR), Steve Nipper (NRCS LA), Jason Nolde (USFS), Latimore Smith (TNC LA), Mike Stroeh (USFWS), Jeff Taverner (AGFC), Dan Weber (TNC LA) and Blaine Elliott (LMVJV). The Working Group considered approximately fourteen different datasets to use in developing the Prioritization Tool and selected three inputs for use in the recommended DPT. Those three inputs were the LMVJV Wild Turkey model, the LMVJV WGCP0 Open Pine Landbird model and the USGS HUC 12 watershed boundaries. The DPT is designed for upland landscapes within the AR/LA CDN geography. The identified priority area, which represents the upper twenty-five percentile priorities, was sub-divided into [four separate focus](#) areas to facilitate regional discussions by the CDN membership. The Working Group also developed an [Upland Delivery Strategy](#) document that describes the process used to create the DPT.

LMVJV Open Pine & Bottomland Landbird Decision Support Models

Anne Mini, LMVJV Science Coordinator, gave an update on the JVs Open Pine Landbird Model which is used in the AR/LA CDN Delivery Priority Tool. The DPT Working Group discovered that the model was constructed with a floodplain filter that removed some important pine areas in the CDN geography. Anne reported that the LMVJV was committed to re-constructing the model within the next year. Currently the LMVJV is developing a West Gulf Coastal Plain bottomland landbird plan that could be completed by the end of the year. It was agreed that the CDN would want to consider initiating the development of a bottomland DPT and updating the Upland DPT when these efforts are finished by the LMVJV. ANHC Approach to Landscape Prioritization and Partnerships in a Focus Area

Bill Holimon with the Arkansas Natural Heritage Commission gave an overview of ongoing priorities and projects in the Arkansas side of CDN Priority Zones A & B. Partnerships with TNC Arkansas, Arkansas Game and Fish Commission and Potlatch Corporation are pursuing the objective of re-establishing corridors up the Ouachita and Saline Rivers to connect with the Ouachita National Forest. Bill noted these objectives fall within the CDNs Priority Zones and how the CDN could pursue similar or the same objectives through additional partnerships enabled by the CDN.

Focus Area Breakouts

After lunch Zone Focus Area breakout groups were formed for each Zone to identify high priority conservation needs, goals, and opportunities for each respective Zone. After a time for brainstorming each Zone facilitator reported back to the CDN membership. Although each Zone has its own unique conservation needs and opportunities there were some common themes across the full CDN geography.

Conservation Goals:

Establish corridors by building on existing projects where available;
Pursue forest management opportunities to promote open pine ecosystems;
Expand fire management on the landscape.

Threats to these Goals:

Land ownership changes;
Public perceptions toward forest management;
Resistance to older forest rotations;
Lack of fire capabilities.

Potential Conservation Actions:

CDN member partnerships combined with both industrial and non-industrial landowners;
Pursue partnership funding; e.g. NRCS, SPI, AACD;
Outreach to Forestry Consultants;
Partner prescribed fire with industrial landowners.

Ongoing projects in Focus Areas:

In Arkansas, project partnerships between ANHC, TNC, AGFC and AACH;
Ongoing programs on the Poison Springs State Forest and Ross Foundation;
Forest Certification;
AGFC Lease Land areas.

Following these discussions Zone Working Groups were formed through voluntary sign-up. Follow-up meetings will be coordinated for each Zone Working Group in the near future. Additionally it was agreed that delivery professionals outside those present would be encouraged to participate in an appropriate Zone Working Group.

Action Items:

- Plan the next CDN membership meeting for December, 2016;
- Request TNC AR representative on the CDN Steering Committee;
- Coordinate Zone Focus Area meetings;
- Consider DPT data/map distribution options; recommended that the DPT Working Group be asked to make that consideration.
