



WETLAND RESERVE EASEMENTS (WRE) ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS IN ARKANSAS

Natural Resources Conservation Service

With the Wetland Reserve Easement (WRE) program, you can:

- Receive up to \$3,200/acre for enrolling in WRE (payment rates vary by zone and land use and are in review for 2022 rate adjustments).
- Reduce risk of farming flood-prone land.
- Develop highly productive wildlife habitat.
- Retain ownership of your property, as well as access control, hunting and fishing rights, and the ability to sell the property.
- Incur little or no out-of-pocket cost for habitat restoration such as tree planting and wetland development.
- Enjoy improved opportunities to observe wildlife as well as increase hunting opportunities for waterfowl, deer, and other wildlife.
- Create potential income from leased hunting.
- Make great memories with family and friends.
- Leave a lasting legacy for your children and grandchildren.
- Contribute to wildlife and ecosystem health regionally.

WRE Eligible Land Types

Ranking and enrollment priority is given to applications that include:

- Farmed Wetlands or Prior Converted Cropland, Pasture, or Hayland
 Other eligible lands may include:
- Former or Degraded Wetlands
- Riparian (stream-side) areas
- Some CRP lands

Funding Opportunities General WRE - statewide

- •<u>Tri-state WREP</u> Delta counties, including funding for underserved landowners
- •MS River WREP lands east of the mainline MS River levee Applications will be considered for all eligible funding opportunities.

How to Apply for WRE

- Applications for WRE may be submitted at your local NRCS Service Center at any time.
- Landowners are encouraged to apply by October 29, 2021 for funding consideration in 2022.
- Applications submitted after October 29, 2021 will be accepted and considered in the next funding period.
